Examples of creative outreach include use of TV, radio or print media and events focused on raising awareness of program availability, or creation of promotional materials.

VAH awards were established by David Kantor, President of Victory Wholesale Group, to recognize outstanding organizations in the United States that work to end hunger and improve nutrition and health at the local level. Fifteen years ago Kantor teamed up with CHC founder, Rep. Tony Hall, because each believed strongly in the value of keeping members of Congress involved in solving the problem of hunger. Today CHC's board co-chairs, Rep. Jo Ann Emerson and Rep. James P. McGovern, carry on this noble tradition.
