Fighfing The Baffles How you're helping this mom

How you're helping this mom fight cancer and food insecurity.

Cindy never imagined she'd need help. But her life completely changed when she was diagnosed with stage 4 lymphoma, a rare blood cancer, in 2018.

Suddenly, she had to leave her 36-year career in accounting to focus on treatment. In a snap, Cindy went from a steady income to no income at all. And now that her son is all grown up, she lives alone. She receives disability benefits, but they just don't stretch far enough to cover the cost of treatment, rent, groceries, and other expenses throughout the month. She's often forced to choose between paying off medical bills or buying everyday essentials.

"I'm managing as best I can," Cindy told us. Thankfully, friends like you stepped in and offered a helping hand.

Cindy used to donate to the Kenner Food Bank, a Second Harvest partner food pantry, and she volunteered there with her son. She knew how much Second Harvest helped neighbors facing hunger — and now that she needs help, Cindy is witnessing firsthand how meaningful a donation can be.

"The help from Second Harvest keeps me from having to buy so much," she says. "I can make my money last longer because of it."



Second Harvest also has a unique program at several hospitals for neighbors like Cindy who are battling cancer. This program ensures they have access to healthier food options that help them feel energized and have an easier time facing treatment. Each month, Cindy gets a box of fresh food from our therapeutic food pantry located in the cancer clinic.
